Col Ed Heal, Commanding Officer of Northwood HQ, gave an update:

- Staffing update:

 - Col Ed Heal is leaving and will be handing over to Col Clinton Read of the Royal Marines on 10 June.
- Focusing on the Anzac service at Harefield

The Chairman invited Paul Bishop from East Anglia Reserve Forces' and Cadets' Association to update.

Events at Imperial War Museum Duxford and county shows. Multiple events planned for the Platinum Jubilee. The unit has conducted training to re-build the skills required within a Medical Regiment ensuring a progressive and challenging programme to improve capability prior to the restructure of the Regiment. Currently have 3 Reservists mobilised. They range from OP RESCRIPT/ PHEONIX, support to PJHQ to providing medical support to BATUK. 6	New standing item: Positive contributions to supporting Armed Forces community from District Champions	
	Cllr Glyn Hayes, Welwyn Hatfield Armed Forces Champion shared work he had done with a service leaver in need of housing. His work resulted in the Council adjusting their calculations for service leavers on a housing list so that they will be equal with civilians and therefore not at a disadvantage because of their service. There was a brief discussion about how housing allocation works for service leavers in other District and Borough Councils. Cllr Andrew Huggins noted he has written to the Minster at the Office of Veteran Affairs regarding a housing issue for a spouse Cllr Julie Banks noted she wasn't aware of issues in Dacorum but will take away to see. Cllr Jacqui Taylor shared that she recently updated St Albans housing allocation policy so that part of it covers spouse/civil partner. She shared this link to St Albans policy.
